More than 50 local residents attended a meeting held by Councillor Leiper on February 6 to discuss the site chosen for the new Civic Hospital (the former site of the Sir John Carling Building). Main concerns raised include increased traffic and decreased livability.

Traffic and Transportation Issues Update

The planned closure of the 417-E ramp is taking place without the benefit of an *area wide transportation plan* to identify the impact of this action in light of the tremendous development in the area (Westgate, Embassy West, Civic Campus relocation). All concerns should be expressed to MPP Yasir Naqvi at ynaqvi.mpp.co@liberal.ola.org.

Several strategies are in use to mitigate the tremendous traffic burden on our streets including the use of digital speed signs and speed bumps. Additionally, the CHNA approved the creation of the *Sherwood Drive Action Plan* which will include the use of traffic calming measures and a review of a proposal for east-west cycling lanes to link with existing nearby cycling networks.

CHNA to attend SOHO OMB Appeal Hearing

CHNA will be a participant at a June 5 Ontario Municipal Board (OMB) appeal by Starwood Group Inc. (SOHO Champagne) of a Committee of Adjustment decision, refusing Starwood's request for a minor variance to allow "temporary" use of 115 Champagne Avenue as a storage site for vehicles owned by Otto's BMW. The illegal and inappropriate usage of the site for storage has been ongoing since the summer of 2016.
