St Stephen's Presbyterian Church, 579 Parkdale Avenue (at Sherwood)

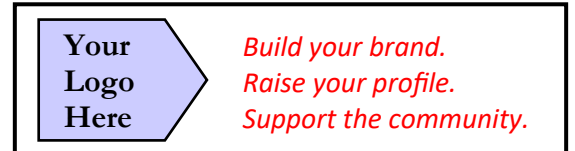
