

Near West Accommodation Review

Overview

Need for Interim Accommodation Measures

By September 2013, Elmdale and Devonshire Public Schools will be unable to accommodate students in available homeroom classes or portables.

Both schools are projected to experience continued enrolment growth and are scheduled to introduce full day kindergarten for September 2014 thereby increasing the need for additional instructional space.

Board at its meeting of November 6th, 2012, approved the Near West Accommodation Review which recognized the need for both Interim Accommodation Measures for September 2013 in addition to the requirement for longer term accommodation solutions for the larger Near West Area.

Accordingly, Interim Accommodation Measures need to be finalized early in the New Year in order to be implemented for September 2013, which also provides for a transition period for parents, students and the school community.

On the following pages, Board staff has outlined two Interim Accommodation Measures for discussion purposes.

In general terms, there are three methods to alter school enrolment as follows;

- 1. Change in school boundary area
- 2. Change in a schools' program offering and,
- 3. Change in a schools' grade structure relocate JK's or gr. 6's.

Given the need to implement a solution for September 2013, Options 1 and 2 above leave little time for community consultation and involve significant student disruption. Given the context of the need for a longer term solution to be developed by the working committee, a grade structure change is being considered.

The relocation of both Devonshire and Elmdale's Gr. 6 EFI classes to Fisher Park is favoured by staff at the moment for reasons articulated in the attached, but we look for your input and will be seeking the input of the broader community on January 23, 2013.



Interim Measure for Discussion

Effective September 2013

 Redirect Devonshire PS and Elmdale PS JK Students to other local area schools

Scenario Details

2013

- A projected 63 JK students (Elmdale) and 60 JK students (Devonshire) would be redirected for September 2013
- Enrolment pressures at both Elmdale and Devonshire Public Schools would be temporarily alleviated for 2013

Points to Consider

- In recent circumstances where the Board has considered interim measures, the Board has typically opted to relocate JK students as disruption was minimized given that the children had not yet integrated into the school community.
- Local area schools (except Elmdale-Devonshire) have each introduced Full Day Kindergarten and cannot readily integrate half day JK students.
- There is no funding allocation to increase the number of Full Day Kindergarten (FDK) classes for Sept 2013 beyond what has already been approved.
- Devonshire and Elmdale each house existing child care programs which support existing students at each school; arrangements which may not be possible at a relocated site.
